SHUL SAFETY 101



What Can Your Shul Do?

- Promote security consciousness among all staff and congregants
- Provide clear emergency response communication and training to congregants
- Develop and implement a detailed security/emergency plan
- Keep doors and windows locked at all times
- Limit open access to the shul by only allowing congregants and visitors to enter through the main entrance

- Hire a trained and experienced guard and evaluate if he should be armed
- Install and maintain panic buttons, alarm systems, and surveillance cameras
- Keep prepaid charged cellphones available in different locations at all times
- Install physical deterrents, such as bollards and/or barriers
- Hire a security professional to perform a thorough security evaluation

- Hire a security coordinator or designate a congregant to oversee and implement all security policies and measures
- **Develop relationships with local** police and fire departments and encourage them to become familiar with your facility
- Hire extra security for Shabbos, Yom Toy, events, and lectures
- Perform lockdown, evacuation and fire drills regularly, even on **Shabbos and Yom Tov**

Active Shooter Response

IMMEDIATELY DETERMINE THE BEST ACTION TO TAKE TO PROTECT YOUR OWN LIFE.

Consider whether it is more dangerous to run outside or shelter inside.

RUN

- Have an escape route and plan in mind
- Leave your belongings behind
- Keep your hands visible

- Hide in an area out of the active shooter's view
- Block entry to your hiding place and lock the doors

- As a last resort and only when your life is in imminent danger
- Attempt to incapacitate the active shooter
- Act with physical aggression and throw items at the active shooter





Call 911 when it is safe to do so.



Stay alert and develop a security consciousness. "If you see something, say something"
