DAVENING KIBBUDIM

Shacharis דַשַׁחָרִיπ

(Musaf קסַיש):_

If there's Leining, (Monday & Thursday, a fast day, Rosh Chodesh, Yom Tov);

Psicha ລກຼາກອ

Kohen, Levi, Yisroel כהֵן, לֵוִי , יִשָּׂרַאֵל _____

מָן הַכָּסֵא Min HaKisei מִן

The person taking the baby from the Sandek and giving him to the person who receives the Kibbud of Amidah Al Habracha

Amidah L'Brachah עַמִידָה לְבְרָכָה The person who holds the baby when the Brachos are said

Mevareich אָבֵרָדְ The person who says the two Brachos following the Bris

Hagba & Gelila הַגְּלִילָה

(If the Bris falls out on a fast day- boy under Bar Mitzva drinks the wine)

BRIS KIBBUDIM

שֵׁם הַתִּינוֹק Shaim Hatinyok

Kvatter/Kvaterin* קַוַואטֵער

Husband and wife who bring the baby into the shul/hall. This kibbud is a segula for children

סַנְדָק Sandek

Distinguished individual who holds the baby on his lap during the Bris (often a Rav, Rosh yeshiva, or grandfather)

M'Hasandek ตูดุธุรุราช

(Optional, takes baby from Sandek's lap and gives him to standing Sandek, usually done by Mohel)

Kisei Shel Eliyahu פָּסֵא שֶׁל אֱלִיַהוּ

Baby is temporarily placed on the chair of Eliyahu

Person who places baby temporarily on the chair of Eliyahu

Me Yad Hakisei מִיַד הַכָּסֵא

The person taking the baby from Kisei Shel Eliyahu and handing over the baby to the father, who then puts the baby on the Sandek's lap

Kriyas HaShem הְרִיאֵת הָשֵׁם The Bracha that gives the baby his name

Amidah Shniyah עַמִידַה שָׁנִיַה

The person who holds the baby during Kriyas Hashaim and then returns him to the Kvaterin who sends the baby back to his mother (Verbally designate Mohel as agent)

* If you need more Kibbudim, some have a Minhag to honor 4 more people with Hagashos between Kvatter and Kissei Shel Eliyahu.

BRIS MILAH

The *Bris Milah* (ritual circumcision) takes place when a baby boy is eight days old (or older, in case of illness or other extenuating circumstances). Following the ceremony, we celebrate the baby's arrival into the world, and this most meaningful occasion.

BEFORE BABY IS BORN (SUBJECT TO MINHAG)

- Purchase or borrow an infant car seat and learn how to install it
- Arrange a night nurse or other assistance
- Consider keeping the umbilical cord for the future for stem cell purposes

WHEN THE BABY IS BORN

- Ask pediatrician in the hospital if baby is jaundiced. Get bilirubin count and give over to *Mohel*. If the baby is jaundiced, make sure he is hydrated. He should be producing 6 wet diapers a day. If he isn't wetting enough, feed more or give formula after each feed to up the number of wet diapers and wash out the bilirubin
- Baby's discharge papers from hospital
- Tell guests the date, time, and location of the Bris (do not invite them)

- Reserve a *Mohel* and meet with him
- E-mail Shuls
- Arrange location of the *Bris* and inform the *Mohel*
- Pick up infant car seat
- Decide on a Hebrew and English name
- Keep emergency number for doctor and discharge papers in an accessible location (*Mohelim* often want to see them, especially if the *Bris* is late)
- Note parents' full Jewish names
- Confirm the night nurse or other assistance
- Arrange to have meals made for the first week or two
- Send flowers or gift to the new mommy
- Arrange for the Shalom Zachar
- Arrange *Peckelach* and food for the *Vach Nacht*
- Notify the doctor and Mohel if there is any change in the baby's condition
- Put away birth certificate and have extra copies for future
- Determine if you need a lactation consultant or La Leche Personnel to help with feeding

THINGS TO DO BEFORE THE BRIS

If bad weather, make sure path and parking lot is plowed, and have contact information of Shul/hall

- Inform family, friends, and Shul bulletin
- Assign who is Sandek and who is Kvatter
- Use worksheet on back cover to prepare a list of *Kibbudim* and backup *Kibbudim*
- Arrange speakers and/or write speech, discuss time guidelines
- Set up chairs up front for the people receiving *Kibbudim* and show them their seat
- □ In case of bad weather, have the *Shul/hall's* contact information
- Book Shul/hall and confirm date and time
- □ Find out combination and alarm of *Shul*/hall
- Get Bris outfit. Leave out the matching shoes that come with the outfit since the child is covered in a blanket anyway, and they will get soiled or lost. Generally, the Mohel will take them off even before the Bris begins
- Let people who are receiving a *Kibbud* know right away
- Set up Skype/Facetime and make sure viewers have passwords if needed. Verify internet access beforehand
- Arrange for easy accessible parking for guests and escort elderly relatives and the mommy and baby
- Set aside reserved tables for family and out of town guests
- Confirm all vendors

- Print out directions to hall/ Shul and alternate route
- □ Arrange the catering and the location of the *Seudah*
- Book photographer/ videographer, and set up time for pictures and video
- Book florist ask about balloons, etc.
- □ Arrange for music
- Set up a table for the Mohel's utensils
- Set up a gift table
- Prepare washing station (if applicable)
- Set up a microphone and podium or stand for speeches
- Reserve chairs for grandparents and the elderly
- Reserve tables for family seating
- Post on community website(s)
- Practice Bracha for the Bris (father of baby)
- Arrange contact person for directions for guests
- Arrange for cleanup staff
- Charge phones and bring charger
- Check alcohol policy of Shul
- Make sleeping arrangements for out of town guests
- Arrange for babysitter/ mother's helper at the *Bris*
- Inquire if there are any special Minhagim
- Arrange transportation to and from the Bris (Remember to have an infant car seat.)
- Check the weather

אָשָׁלוֹם זָכָר BEFORE (FRIDAY (NIGHT SHALOM ZACHOR

(ONLY FOR ASHKANAZIM)

- Inform guests of the time and location of the Shalom Zachor, and possibly Bris
- Compose Dvar Torah
- Buy chickpeas, cake, nosh, beer, soda, paper goods, cutlery
- E-mail friends and family
- □ Notify *shul* bulletins
- **Emergency numbers**

בִיל שְׁמִירָה NIGHT BEFORE THE BRIS

VACHT NACHT/QEIL SHMIRA 9ALSO CALLED ZOHAR OR BRIT 9YITZCHAK BY SEFARDIM

- Inform children of the time to come and say Shema and Hamalach Hagoel
- Inform adult guests and tell them location and time of the Vacht Nacht (if it is your Minhag to have a Seuda).
- If it is your Minhag for the father and/or Sandek to go to the Mikvah, then plan to start your day even earlier
- Give the baby a bath and soak the Bris area very well
- Give candy packages (peckelach) to the children
- Prepare a meal and play music (if *Minhag*)
- □ Father of baby stays up to learn *Torah* (if able to)
- Compose Dvar Torah
- Set TWO alarm clocks

TEMS TO BRING TO THE BRIS

- The *Mohel's* contact information
- 2 Kiddush cups and Kosher sweet wine/grape juice
- Corkscrew for wine
- Besamim (Sefardim)
- 🖵 A Shofer (Sefardi Minhag)
- 🖵 3 Taleisim
- List of Kibbudim
- Relevant Seforim
- Bris pillow (fancy ones can be obtained from gemachim), white pillow case
- Generation Father's Tallis and Tefillin
- Dvar Torah/Speech
- Yarmulkas for baby and guests
- Kisei Shel Eliyahu and "sturdy" chair for Sandek
- 🖵 Tehillim cards
- Ceremonial Challah
- Camera, video camera, extra memory cards and batteries
- Cell phone and charger
- Check book/cash to pay vendors and *Mohel*
- Tissues
- Waste basket
- Bentchers/Siddurim
- Candles and Matches
- Special *Tefillah* for mother when she gives her son over (*Shevet Musar perek 24*)
- List of *Brachos* for Bentching
- List of people to thank, especially wife, parents, in-laws, siblings, people who traveled far, relatives, elderly, *Rebbeim*

- Toys and snacks for older siblings
- Foil (for people rushing to work to wrap up food)
- Briefcases, if children are going straight from Bris to school
- Stool for *Sandek* (if applicable)
- □ *Bentchers* and/or *Siddurim* available for Bentching
- If doing yourself, bring tablecloths, paper goods, food, and drinks, appoint someone to make sure that everything refrigerated is set out on the tables in the morning, before everyone heads for the hall
- A good source of light (flashlight)
- Community phone book
- A Kiddush cup for the baby to use when he gets older (optional)

FOR THE BABY

- Ask your Mohel if he would like you to purchase any specific brand or type of the items listed here and, if he has any specific directives for the preparations since supplies and directives vary by Mohel
- Bottle of sugar water
- Disposable 2-3 of each and cloth, 3-4 of each
- Find out from Mohel which supplies are needed on the Men's side and which are needed on the Women's side during Bris and organize accordingly
- Gauze pads, Infant Tylenol

- Wipes Alcohol-free wipes (more sensitive to area), powder and lotion
- Bottles, pacifiers
- Rubbing alcohol
- Receiving blanket and extra blankets
- Nursing pads, burp cloths
- Antibiotic ointment Bacitracin, tube of Vaseline
- Extra change of clothing
- Infant car seat (put in night before)
- Stroller

GAT THE MEAL

- Take family pictures
- Appoint someone to lead Zemiros
- Find the leader of Bentching and signal him when to begin
- Arrange washing stations

AFTER THE BRIS

- Take Benchers
- Day Mohel
- Pay vendors
- Pay hall/Shul
- Give away flowers/balloons
- Have the Mohel check the baby and arrange for a house visit as well Ask what symptoms are normal, and if there are any symptoms to be on alert for after the bris is performed
- Bring home leftover food (distribute to needy families)
- Gemach (if borrowed)
- Arrange meals for the week or direct people to person arranging them

- Create photo album
- Email photos
- Write thank you notes for gifts
- Check before leaving to make sure you didn't leave anything at the hall
- □ The Bacitracin should be put on the area for 3 days. If *Shabbos* is one of those days, make sure to tear open the gauze wrappers before *Shabbos* and make sure not to smear the bacitracin on *Shabbos*
- Keep the Bris area doublediapered during the next
 3 days for added comfort

ן הֵבָן וֹידְפָ FOR THE PIDYON HABEN

- Calculate the 31st day after the baby's birth
- Arrange for a *Kohen* to officiate
- Arrange the hall and the caterer/meal
- Large silver tray
- Pillow to cushion the tray
- Uvine or grape juice and corkscrew
- Five silver coins
- Garlic and sugar cube packets to distribute
- Jewelry to drape over the baby

Bentchers

Diapers and baby paraphernalia

- Candles and candlesticks to place on tables, matches or lighter
- Package of safety pins (for pinning on the jewelry)
- 🖵 Kiddush Cup
- □ *Siddur* (for the ceremony) and *Bentchers* for all

SPECIAL MINHAGIM/CUSTOMS AND HALACHOS IN KLAL YISROEL:

- Sefardim hang Kabbalistic charts on the walls and doors of the child's room against 'evil spirits'. Some put the Milah knife under the child's pillow in the night before the Bris
- Sefardim say Shechiyanu after the Bracha on the Milah and a Shofar is also blown at the Bris
- It is a custom for both Ashkenazi and Sefardi fathers to try to learn Torah all night before the baby's Bris

HALACHOS AND INYANIM

- All those present, except the Sandek stand for the duration of the Bris
- The father, Sandek and Mohel all go the the mikvah in the morning before the Bris
- Some smell Bisamim at the Bris
- During the Seuda, it is a Minhag to give Tzedaka and sing Z'miros
- + The father does not go to work until the *Milah* is over
- The Bris Seuda and Pidyon Haben are Seudas Mitzvos.
 It is nice therefore for the meal to include meat and wine, and for there to be a Minyan for Bentching
- The parents and son dress for the occasion to show their love of the *Mitzvohs*

THINGS TO NOTE:

- If there is a change in the baby's health, notify the pediatrician and mohel immediately. Call 911/hospital/Hatzalah in case of an emergency
- Make sure the baby is fed one hour prior to the bris but no sooner than 1/2 hour before the Bris
- Do not apply diaper rash cream starting from the night before the Bris (you may put on cream after the Bris)
- Dress the baby in a "onesie" underneath the Bris outfit
- Wait 5 days to give the baby a bath
- It is normal if there is a yellowish color by the healing or pinkish from dried blood
- The bandage may be taken off gently after 24 hours. If it falls off, don't put on a new one
- The father should wear Tallis and Tefillin during a Bris held during the week
- If not in regular shul: need Sefer Torah, siddurim, if Bris held in the Shul after davening
- Turn on heat or A/C in Shul/hall

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
